Chapel History

The Chapel of St. Maximos the Confessor is located in the home of Father Symeon and Presbytera Bridget. Originally located in Albuquerque. New Mexico, as of November 2104 the chapel has been moved (with the blessing of Bishop John) to the Black Forest area on the north side of the Colorado Springs, Colorado, greater metropolitan area. (Father Symeon is also serving in the Chapel of St. Mark of Ephesus located in the Security-Widefield area on the south side of the Colorado Springs metropolitan area.)

The original founding of the chapel in was publicly announced the first week of October, 2006, when the following article was approved for release and submitted to the local newspapers:

This week a new Eastern Orthodox chapel was dedicated to St. Maximos the Confessor here in Albuquerque. Serving the Liturgy was Archimandrite George of the Dormition Skete, Buena Vista, Colorado. The chapel (and skete) are under the omophorion (jurisdiction) of His Eminence, The Most Reverend Archbishop Gregory of Denver and Colorado.

Following this, for several years reader services were regularly held, with Holy Liturgy being served in the chapel on those occasions when visiting clergy were present. To better serve the faithful in the area, on the Sunday of the New Martyrs of Russia in

2009, Archbishop Gregory ordained Father Symeon up through the ranks of the clergy to

deacon. Then, on Holy Saturday in 2009, Father Symeon was blessed and consecrated by Archbishop Gregory to the priesthood for the church of Saint Maximos the Confessor.
